# Family Story

"On July 7th, 2025, our baby girl was born 2 months ahead of schedule, and our NICU life began at Golisano. Baby and I were separated for 5 days in different hospitals, so Dad stayed with the baby as I requested. Our NICU life was not ideal, but the love and support our nurses gave us was phenomenal. Our social worker suggested we apply for the Ronald McDonald House. I felt we weren't worthy of staying there because our daughter was achieving her milestones. The social worker reassured me, and we were put on the waiting list. We stayed at the hospital every night except once a week, to reload on clothes, and I felt my heart ripping from my chest the further away we were from the hospital. Close to the end of our NICU stay, they moved us to a room where there was no sofa, only two chairs. My heart sank. The social worker called me the next day and informed us that the Ronald McDonald House was available, which was perfect timing. I immediately called my husband and told him. When I tell you that from the moment I stepped foot in the door, I felt the love and presence from complete strangers. They made me feel at home right away. When my husband joined me after work, he felt the same way. It was like we all knew each other. It was warm and inviting. We stayed for 12 days, and in that time, we made friends for a lifetime. My husband and I cannot begin to say how grateful and blessed we are for the Ronald McDonald House and the beautiful souls who run it! When we thought we were going to be able to bring our girl home, they cheered for us and warned us just in case. Luckily, they did, because she had bradycardia and they had to keep her for another 72 hours. When that day came they were excited for us again. We came back to the Ronald McDonald House with our sweet girl and the excitement we were greeted with was as equal to when our families found out we were coming home. We plan to visit in the future and volunteer our time some how. Thank you so much from the bottom of our hearts for not only such an amazing place but for the amazing, beautiful, and wonderful people that are there!" - Elisenda Roberson

On our way home, we even had the chance to stop by the Ronald McDonald House in Tallahassee. It was a perfect way to round out a week of connection and inspiration.

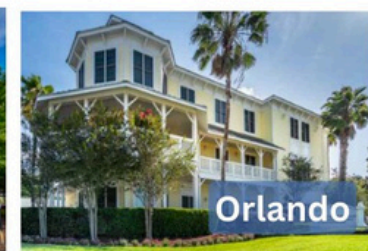
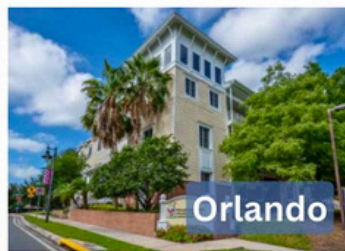

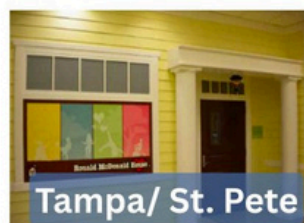
# Florida Strong

# Two Families. One Mission.

Two Families. One Mission. Generations of Love. We are honored to celebrate not one, but two extraordinary families whose legacies are deeply rooted in the heart of RMHC SWFL: the Fewster and Rocque families. The Fewster Family has been part of RMHC SWFL since before the House existed. Barbara Fewster, a former Board and Executive Committee member, multi-time Storybook Ball Chair, and Eat Clay Love "celebrity painter," was a true founding force. She and her husband, Tom Sr., helped bring both the Columbus House and the Southwest Florida House to life.

Their legacy continued through their daughter-in-law, Beverly Fewster (formerly Rocque), who has chaired major events, served on the Board and Executive Committee, and volunteered tirelessly alongside her husband, Tom Jr. Both Barbara and Beverly received the RMHC SWFL President's Award for their extraordinary service.
